Included in the charge home is their share of the cost for the faculty sponsor. Costs may vary according to the the number of students attending the event. Students are NOT given money for movies or the mall. If a meal in the dining hall will be missed due to the activity, students may be given money for food which will be charged. You should discuss with your student what you feel is reasonable to spend for a month or a term for entertainment.
